

Jeopardy Trivia

We have chosen six categories with six questions in each category. The categories are: Double Entendres, Juicy Fruits, Love Is in the Air, Travel, June Observances, and A Bridge Too Far.

Choose from one of the following activities:

- Print a copy of the Jeopardy questions and answers. Play as a group or in teams. The “host” reads the clue, and the group/team tries to come up with the question/answer. Keep score and award points. Print [pictures](#) to hand out as visual clues for some of the trivia questions.
- Set up a Jeopardy board. Draw a grid. Write the six categories across the top of a whiteboard or flip chart, and write the dollar amounts below each category. Play as a group, in teams, or with three contestants, as on the TV show. Keep score and award points. Mark off each amount after it is awarded. The first person/team to answer correctly gets to select the next category and amount. Choose a Daily Double question in advance and award double points for the correct answer. Players can wager any amount of their winnings during the Final Jeopardy round. Alternate answers appear in parentheses after the primary answer.

Trivia Questions and Answers

Double Entendres (words with double meanings—nouns [n] and/or verbs [v])


1. (\$100) Six-letter word beginning with *B*: The person responsible for hitting the ball in baseball (n) or something used to coat food before it is deep-fried (n).
Answer: What is batter? If you don't want to use beer in a batter, you can achieve the same consistency with soda water.
2. (\$200) Three-letter word beginning with *B*: To prohibit something such as alcohol (v) or the declaration of the prohibition (n).
Answer: What is ban? Other synonyms for *ban* include *bar*, *enjoin*, and *forbid*.
3. (\$400) Five-letter word beginning with *C*: White, fluffy element high in the atmosphere (n) or to obscure an idea (v).
Answer: What is cloud? The white, fluffy clouds are cumulus clouds. If they're filled with rain, they are called nimbus clouds. Thunderstorms originate inside cumulonimbus clouds.

4. (\$600) Five-letter word beginning with *D*: To move rhythmically to music (v) or a party where you move to music (n).

Answer: What is dance? If you want to get in a good mood, put on some dance music when no one is around and get down.

5. (\$800) Five-letter word beginning with *E*: Digital communication you receive in your inbox (n) or to send a digital communication over the internet (v).

Answer: What is email? Email is responsible for the demise of personal mail. If you want to make someone's day, mail them a handwritten note.



6. (\$1,000) Four-letter word beginning with *L*: The ground on which a house sits (n) or to set an airplane down after flying (v).

Answer: What is land? Land is measured in acres in the U.S., but in many parts of the world, it's measured in hectares.

Juicy Fruits

7. (\$100) This tiny juicy fruit used to make wine comes in shades of red, green, purple, and black.

Answer: What is grape? Of nearly 16,000 grape varieties, 10,000 are used in making wine.

8. (\$200) Cantaloupe and honeydew belong to this generic category of fruit.

Answer: What is melon? There is a variety of honeydew that comes from China and tastes like a juicy pear. It has a yellow exterior and a white interior.

9. (\$400) This green fruit has hair on the outside, and the easiest way to eat it is to cut it in half and scoop the flesh with a spoon. It shares its name with a flightless bird and is also the nickname for a person from New Zealand.

Answer: What is kiwi? It is packed with fiber, folic acid, and potassium.

10. (\$600) These juicy fruits often appear in mixed chocolate candy boxes, and if you don't know what you've chosen, the juice can squirt everywhere when you bite into it.

Answer: What is cherry? Cherries come in sweet and tart varieties.

11. (\$800) Be careful of this juicy, red berry when you pick it. Many varieties have thorns.

Answer: What is raspberry? In addition to the familiar red raspberry, there are yellow, pink, purple, and black varieties.



12. (\$1,000) This berry begins with *E* and is often used in natural cough syrups, including the Sambucol brand.

Answer: What is elderberry? They are also used in making jam and syrups. They are never eaten raw because they are poisonous unless cooked. Raw elderberries have a compound in them that is converted into cyanide when processed during digestion.

Love Is in the Air

13. (\$100) It takes fewer or more than five minutes to decide if you like someone.

Answer: What is fewer? It takes only four minutes. That's the reason we talk about love at first sight.

14. (\$200) It takes one or more years for the "madly in love" stage to turn into committed love.

Answer: What is one? Perhaps that's the reason so many people get engaged after dating for one year.

15. (\$400) This is the name for the 50th wedding anniversary.

Answer: What is gold or golden? The traditional and modern gifts are gold. The traditional flower is the violet. Some couples take a special trip or renew their wedding vows on their 50th anniversary.



16. (\$600) Jewish couples get married under this.

Answer: What is *chuppah* or canopy? It represents the new home the couple will establish.

17. (\$800) This is what *love* means in tennis.

Answer: What is "no score"? Tennis has a unique scoring system. One point equals 15; two points equal 30; three points equal 40. A score of 40–40 is called deuce. At deuce, the winner must score two more points because you must win a tennis game by two points.

18. (\$1,000) At the wedding, the groom stands on this side of the bride.

Answer: What is right? The tradition started so the groom's sword hand would be free to ward off any possible opponent.

Travel

19. (\$100) This document is required for international travel.

Answer: What is passport? In addition, visas are required by many countries. A passport is a form of identification issued by your country, and a visa is an entry document issued by the country you visit.



20. (\$200) This is the U.S. government security agency at airports.

Answer: What is TSA? It stands for Transportation Security Administration. Before 9/11, the airlines were responsible for security.

21. (\$400) Nicknamed "the pond," we cross this ocean to get to Europe from the East Coast of North America.

Answer: What is the Atlantic Ocean? West Coast nonstops take a different route across the North Pole. They are called polar flights.

22. (\$600) When you take a cruise, you will get this document, which lists ports of call, arrival and departure times, etc.

Answer: What is itinerary? All cruise itineraries are subject to change due to weather.

23. (\$800) Unless you are traveling to Chad in Africa, you no longer need this vaccination, since it has been nearly eradicated across the globe.

Answer: What is smallpox? It was officially declared eradicated in 1979.

24. (\$1,000) This Portuguese-speaking country is a top destination in South America.

Answer: What is Brazil? Brasilia is the capital city of Brazil. The city is an urban planning project opened in 1960. It was planned to be “orderly and effective” for work.



June Observances

25. (\$100) This parent gets a whole lot of love on the third Sunday of June.

Answer: Who is father? It's Father's Day, and this is a reminder to wish the fathers in your life a happy Father's Day on that date.

26. (\$200) June 16 and 17 both celebrate this least favorite food group for kids.

Answer: What is vegetable? June 16 is Fresh Veggies Day, and June 17 is National Eat Your Vegetables Day.

27. (\$400) On June 1, the world celebrates these two family members.

Answer: What are parents? It's Global Day of Parents.

28. (\$600) June 4 is the day to hug this furry, four-legged pet.

Answer: What is cat? It's Hug Your Cat Day. Some cats do not like to be hugged, but Hug Your Cat Day comes only once a year.

29. (\$800) This Disney character who is Daisy's boyfriend is commemorated on June 9.

Answer: Who is Donald Duck? He was Walt Disney's second most popular character.

30. (\$1,000) June 13 commemorates this garden chore.

Answer: What is weeding? It's National Weed Your Garden Day.



A Bridge Too Far

31. (\$100) This is the famous bridge in San Francisco.

Answer: What is Golden Gate? The bridge replaced a ferry service.

32. (\$200) You'll find the Rialto Bridge over the Grand Canal in this Italian city.

Answer: What is Venice? It's the most famous bridge over the Grand Canal.

33. (\$400) This bridge in Alaska, nicknamed the bridge to this place, was finally canceled.

Answer: What is nowhere? The Bridge to Nowhere was a \$223 million project to link a small town to an airport. Alternate transportation systems are in place.

34. (\$600) This Overseas Highway, also known as U.S. Highway 1, traverses the islands in a southeastern state collectively known as this.

Answer: What are the (Florida) Keys? Forty-two bridges connect the Florida mainland to Key West.



35. (\$800) This bridge in England is part of the code phrase for the plan that comes into effect when Queen Elizabeth dies.

Answer: What is London Bridge? Operation London Bridge is a 10-day plan for the days following the queen's death. It's also referred to as "London Bridge is down."

36. (\$1,000) This very long Louisiana bridge crosses a lake by the same name.

Answer: What is Pontchartrain? The Pontchartrain Causeway is the longest bridge over water in the world.


Final Jeopardy
