

Happy Birthday!

Debbie Reynolds (2005–2016) was a mega-talented American actress, singer, and dancer. The acclaimed entertainer was first noticed at a beauty pageant in 1948. Reynolds was soon making movies and earned a nomination for a Golden Globe Award for Most Promising Newcomer. She became a major force in Hollywood musicals, including *Singin’ In the Rain*, *Bundle of Joy*, and *Star Wars*. In 1969, *The Debbie Reynolds Show* debuted on TV. The iconic star continued to perform in film, theater, and TV well into her 80s. Her daughter was actress Carrie Fisher.



Answers
